Meeting of the Trustees of the Friends of Dorchester Abbey

The Trustees normally meet three times a year to discuss ideas and issues concerning the maintenance, developments, and improvements for the Abbey. They last met on Monday May 21.

The following items were discussed:

 Update on proposed plans for the Abbey Guesthouse

Nick Forman joined the meeting to report on progress. The Team working on the

project consists of Nick, Ian Brace, David Rossington and Mike Frith. The challenge is, as always, to balance needs and aspirations with budget and fundraising possibilities.

• Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust Conference Day (and see below)

This is planned for September 28, 2019 and aims to bring together Friends groups from other historic churches in Oxfordshire. The Rector is working with the Chairman of the Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust, Dr Stephen Goss, to organise what will clearly be a fascinating and very informative day conference. Save the date!

Beauforest Brass

As is well-known, Richard Beauforest saved the building from destruction in 1536. The Trustees discussed the future location and protection of the Beauforest Brass, and will be working with the PCC to bring proposals forward.

Herb Garden

The Herb Garden is in a good state following the April working party. The Friends contribute £2000 a year for general garden maintenance for the Abbey, and it was agreed to ask the gardener to include the Herb Garden in this work.

Friends Outing

25 people took part in a very successful outing to Wells Cathedral in May. Yvonne Lawden was thanked for the superb organisation of this annual event which is a high point in the Friends' year.

AGM 2018

The AGM took place on June 4 in the Abbey at 6.30 p.m.

The Chairman reported on the past year's activities. This has not involved major expenditure, though it has included approval of additional lighting, and regular discussions of the Guest House project. He also reported on the very successful 2017 Dorchester Lecture which was given by Dame Helen Ghosh, then Director General of the National Trust.

The Rector presented her report for her 13th AGM, and welcomed Bishop Colin. She expressed appreciation for the annual funds to support gardening which have included significant improvements to the Rose Walk path. She mentioned the exhibition planned for the Cloister Gallery from late October to Epiphany featuring work by a local artist Adrian Brooks on the theme of Light – A Spiritual Journey. The exhibition comprises a series of art works based on Shrines by Adrian Brooks, projected images from the Hubble Telescope and an eight minute piece of music by our own composer, Tim Cook. This exhibition has a number of important features linking it to the spiritual history of the building and the locality. It will create a 'mini pilgrimage' in a traditional place of pilgrimage set in the context of some of the most recent understandings of the Creation. The Rector said that she hopes that it will inspire visitors throughout the busy Advent to Epiphany season to think

more widely about the spiritual and the creation on the largest and deepest possible scale.

Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust

Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust (OHCT) was formed in 1964 to support Oxfordshire's churches and chapels. OHCT awards grants to places of Christian worship of all denominations provided that they are at least 50 years old and open for regular public worship. These

grants are used mainly for repairs or practical enhancements, also for installation of roof alarms against the theft of lead.

The Trust is a volunteer organisation, receiving income from grants and legacies, from its annual Ride and Stride (which is its most important source of income). It organises a lecture programme and Church tours to some of the lovely churches of Oxfordshire. Oxfordshire is home to over 400 churches, chapels and places of Christian worship, many of them of considerable historical significance, such as Dorchester Abbey, and countless other wonderful small churches in the city and villages across the county.

Joining the Trust is an enjoyable way of visiting some of these churches, and helping in the preservation of Oxfordshire's heritage of churches and chapels. Beauforest Society
